Participation in the open class is free, although a small barn fee applies if entering beef, goats, and sheep only. Use this premium book as a guide to find a variety of featured categories, an entry form, schedule of events, and instructions and rules. **We have new premium payout amounts this year in EVERY division.**

Please feel free to bring your items to Open Class registration and get all the help you need entering your fair exhibits. Likewise, if you have questions or have made items not listed in this book do not hesitate to call **(406) 470-0389** for any additional help. - **Preregistration of projects not required.**
- **You kids twelve and under, you will receive a free ice cream cone when you bring in 5 or more entries.**
- **If you are bring a beef entry, please call the Open Class Fair phone (406) 470-0389 by Sunday, July 15th to reserve pen space.**

If you want to enter a pencil drawing and dried beans (example below) you would fill out the entry form included in the book and bring it to the Open Class registration office on **July 17th or 18th**. You will be issued an exhibitor number & entry tag. Your exhibit will be judged, displayed during the fair, and if awarded a ribbon you will earn premium money for your effort. Look through the book make sure to note the DIVISION, CLASS, and LOT to enter on the entry form. If you have any questions, bring your exhibits to the open class office (under the east end of the grandstands) and we will help you register. **Pick-Up times have changed. Items may be picked up Saturday evening from 6:30p.m.-8:30p.m., but you may NOT drive a vehicle to the building. Sunday pick-up is from 9:30-11:30a.m. and MAY drive a car to the exhibit buildings.**

GENERAL PREMIUM RULES

1. The Marias Fair Board reserves the right to interpret all rules and regulations and to settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto, arising out of and not covered by them.
2. Any person who violates any of the following or special rules published in the premium list will forfeit all privileges and premiums and may be subject to such penalty as ordered by the Marias Fair Board.
3. The Marias Fair Board, Toole County, or employees or agents thereof will assume NO liability for injury, loss or damage sustained by person, property or livestock of any exhibitors, concessionaire or spectator. Every animal and article upon the grounds shall be under the control of the fair management.
4. Management will put forth every effort to ensure the safety of exhibitors' articles after their arrival, but in no case will it be responsible for loss or damage which may occur while in transit or during the time of exhibition.
5. All open class exhibitors will abide by the general premium rules and regulations as well as those under each department.
6. For premium books and entry blanks, phone or pick them up at the Marias Fair Office, stop by the extension offices in Toole, Glacier, Liberty and Pondera County, or follow the links on-line at www.mariasfair.com.
7. Each department specifies when entries are due in and specify rules apply. Early entry is encouraged if possible! Exhibits may be dropped off at the open exhibit office any time the week of the fair.

8. Entries must be made on Marias Fair entry blanks. Make sure you give your name, full address and phone. Use correct division, class, lot numbers and exact wording for each exhibit.
9. Livestock fees will be assessed on cattle, sheep, and goats. Fees are due at time of entry.
10. Premiums money paid out in each class will be listed at the beginning of every department unless otherwise stated in the class or lot.
11. Premium money is collected at the fair office after the departments' judges books are returned to the premium office and the placing are calculated.
12. Any discrepancy on premium money paid out will be handled through the open class office and the exhibitor must present the original copy of the exhibitor tag and that copy must match the office copy of the exhibitor tag as proof of award.
13. Where there is but one exhibitor in a lot the judge shall award only one premium. There is no limit to the number of animals or items an exhibitor may enter per class. **If competition is from only one exhibitor, premiums will be paid on the first place only.**
14. Superintendents reserve the right to reject unworthy entries of any nature.
15. Agreement to all conditions and regulations here stated are understood when the exhibitor submits their entry.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Entry Fee: **\$5.00 per animal entered, due at the time of registration.**
2. Cattle must be in the livestock barn by Thursday at 6:00 p.m. The cattle must remain in place through 6:30 p.m. Saturday.
3. Exhibitor must have original registration certificate (if applicable) on each animal available for inspection at the show. Exhibitor must be a bona fied owner of the cattle.
4. Entries that arrive at the show having ten head or more of any one breed, will have its own show, if not, exhibits will be combined with other breeds and then divided by age into classes of equal numbers.
5. There is no limit to the number of animals and exhibitor may enter per class. **If competition is from only one exhibitor, premiums will be paid on the first place only.**
6. All animals will be shown with a halter and all bulls will be shown with a nose lead; for safety purposes, bulls older than those listed in the premium booklet will not be allowed in the show. Mothers of unweaned calves entered in registered classes will be allowed in the barn even if the cow is not entered into a class, space permitting.
7. Attendants of cattle must be on duty from 10 a.m. until commencement of the evening show.
8. All cattle must have a bangs and tuberculosis test, in accordance with Department of Livestock, Animal Health Division, Helena, MT. Call the Marias Veterinary Clinic for more information, phone 434-5176.

9. Wood chip bedding only. The fair board will provide initial wood chips: all other chips and feed must be provided by the exhibitor. Additional chips may be purchased through the superintendent.

10. Exhibitors must be present for judging

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. Entries open to the State of Montana. **Entry Fee \$3.00 must be paid at time of entry.** Animals must be in place by Thursday noon and are not to be removed before 6:30 p.m. Saturday.
2. Exhibitor must be a bona fied owner for at least three months. All lambs eligible must have dropped on or after January 1st of the current year. For lambs six months of age, exhibitor must be able to produce certificate of registration.
3. All entries must meet health requirements and show association qualifications. Any animal may be rejected by the superintendent for communicable disease, lice, or any objectionable health defect. It is recommended that all sheep be sprayed or dipped within 30 days prior to the fair.
4. Feed must be provided by exhibitor. Attendants to sheep must be on duty to take care of them and keep the pens clean.
5. **Bedding-Wood Chips Only**-Initial wood chips will be provided and additional chips may be purchased from the superintendent.
6. There is no limit to the number an exhibitor may enter per class. **If competition is from only one exhibitor, premiums will be paid on the First Place Only.**
7. Exhibitors **must be present** for judging in order to qualify for premium money.
8. Entries that arrive at the show ring having over 10 head or more of any one breed, will have its own show, if not, exhibits will be combined with other breeds and then divided by age into classes at the judges discretion.

1. Entries open to the State of Montana. – **Entry Fee \$3.00 must be paid at time of entry.**
2. All entries must be AGS purebreds or ADGA Purebreds, Americans and recorded grades. Classes will be held for unrecorded does. ADGA rules shall govern. Papers must be presented to the superintendent upon entry or prior to showing.
3. Entries that arrive at the show having over 10 head of any one breed, will have its own show, if not, exhibits will be combined with other breeds and then divided by age into classes of equal number.
4. There is no limit to the number an exhibitor may enter per class. **If competition is from only one exhibitor, premium will be paid on the First Place Only.**
5. All champions must be present for best of show.
6. No horned goats will be allowed. Scurs are acceptable.
7. All animals shown in group classes must have been shown in their regular classes.
8. Animals must be free of all communicable disease. Superintendent reserves the right to ask for the removal of any animal exhibiting signs of disease or infection. In case of a dispute, a veterinarian may be called at the exhibitor's expense.
9. Owners **must be present** for judging in order to qualify for premiums.

3. Initial wood chips will be provided and additional wood chips are available to buy through the superintendent and feed must be furnished by exhibitor.
4. All exhibits must be owned by the exhibitor, and entries must be made in the name of the actual owners.
5. When entering your bird, be specific as to breed and variety and use lot number to designate age and sex.
6. Exhibitors **must be present** for judging in order to receive premium money. **If competition is from one exhibitor, premiums will be paid on first place ONLY.**
7. Exhibits are not to be removed before 6:30 p.m. Saturday and pens are properly cleaned.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Please enter flower entries on a separate entry form (i.e. separate from other classes such as home arts).
2. Entries are welcome from members of garden clubs and the general public.
3. Exhibitors must bring glass containers to display cut flowers.
4. Judging will be done on individual merit. Absence of competition will not be accepted as justification for awarding a high prize for inferior quality.
5. Do not add more stems than the premium list requires or exhibit will be disqualified.
6. Entries cannot be replaced with fresh flowers until judging has been completed and superintendent shall have the right to remove any exhibits which have become unsightly.
7. No professional or anyone making a business of growing flowers for sale is allowed to show.
8. If exhibitor is a member of a garden club, this should be noted on the entry blank under "Community" so that the proper garden club will receive credits toward the "Big Sky Award" in lot.
9. Exhibits are judged on the following: 40% Quality of Material; 25% Size; 25% Color; 10% Stem and Foliage
10. Exhibitors may pick up their articles Saturday after 6:30 p.m.
11. There is no limit to the number an exhibitor may enter per class. If competition is from one exhibitor in one lot, premiums will be paid on the first place only.

Hints to exhibitors: If plant material is to hold up through the exhibition period, it must be cut no later than the day before it is to be exhibited. Cutting should be done about 4:00 p.m. since at that time there is the greatest amount of sugar in the leaves, and as soon the flowers are plunged in water, they take up enough to overcome any temporary wilting. Plunging stems into water at 110 Degrees F. is usually best, then set in a cool room, out of any draft and let the water cool to room temperature. This enables the flower to regain their turgidity and last much longer. Cut stems cleanly at an angle with a sharp knife and place at once in deep water. Flowers should be kept in deep water 8-12 hours or overnight. All foliage that is below the waterline should be removed. Foliage should be clean, any broken, diseased or disfigured foliage or petals removed. Flowers or branches with wood stems, such as Phlox, stocks, Chrysanthemums, should be split, crushed or pounded before being placed water and placed in a dark, cool place during the day. Exhibitors should pay close attention to grooming all exhibits by removing all dirt, spray residue, dead leaves and blooms, foliage used in arrangement, such as hosta, vegetable leaves, canna, peony, etc. should be immersed in water overnight.
